Notes Fullerton College Campus Forum Meeting:

- Existing parking structure – no “Green-Screen” – too large.
- Potentially look at location south of the existing campus.
- Educational element of the Master Plan more important than parking structure.
- Recommended locations (Parking Structure) – Lot E and Private Property to the east of Lot E or west of the field house.
- Proposed parking structure to accommodate 1000 cars.
- Question, what happens to tennis courts – proposed to be placed on top of parking structure? Discussed alternate possible locations at ground level.
- Would City of Fullerton allow a signal to be installed in conjunction with parking structure? The city would likely require one.
- The Child Development Center is a “Lab” School – Requiring instructional spaces and programs.
- The installation of a signal at the north side of the site to support the parking structure could also allow safe crossing from the M & O Facility (Proposed Location).
- Clarified that the projects shown on the current Master Plan are “Place Holders” in lieu of defined programs.
- Noted that there have been several traffic accidents from north entrance to campus due to students turning left from parking lot on to Berkeley.
- Suggested “Welcome Center” be located on Chapman Ave., for greater visibility.
- Humanities Division is currently spread out through the campus – it is quite inefficient.
- Suggested consolidating Humanities in Building 500 – need to provide Faculty Offices as well.
- Interest in 21st Century instructional spaces.
- Suggested that other functions, such as offices, could be included with the design of the parking structure to assist with mitigating light pollution.
- Expressed the importance of incorporating Green Technology – Sustainable Design
- It is understood that the City of Fullerton is planning to develop “Wilshire” into a more bike/pedestrian friendly street.
- Suggested harvesting rain water for use in irrigating the turf fields.
- Pedestrian crossing at Chapman is dangerous – suggested “All Way” pedestrian crossing at intersection.
- Internal pedestrian patterns on campus are dangerous when intersecting with vehicles.

- Suggested the parking structure span over “Centennial Way” to remove potential shading problem with horticulture.
- Suggested parking structure be broken into two (2) structures and placed at Field House area and adjacent to Performing Arts Complex.
- Question whether the soccer field be placed on top of the parking structure – listed precedents other area colleges.
- Could the parking structure be placed over the existing pool?
- Suggested consolidating campus safety and health services.
- Current location of Health Services is fine but it is too small.
- Questioned what the time-line to begin construction is – 2018.
- Suggested potentially relocating the pool.
- Campus noted that they are working with the City regarding Plummer Parking Structure – potentially being given to the college.
- Interest in a Ceramic Mural – Depicting view of the hills and the Red Car Trolley.
- Questioned if there are any plans to acquire historic house on south side of campus.
- Suggested locating new Humanities Building is built on “East Quad” – which is currently a parking lot.
