The Admissions & Records Office, Bursar's Office, Counseling Department, Bookstore, Extended Opportunity Program and Services (EOPS) Office, Career Counseling, and Workforce Center may all be found in the 2000 Building.

The adjacent 2001 Building holds the classrooms for Cinema/Radio & Television courses.

Facing Lemon Street is the Wilshire Auditorium. This auditorium hosts a variety of classes and events and is a more intimate venue than the Campus Theatre.

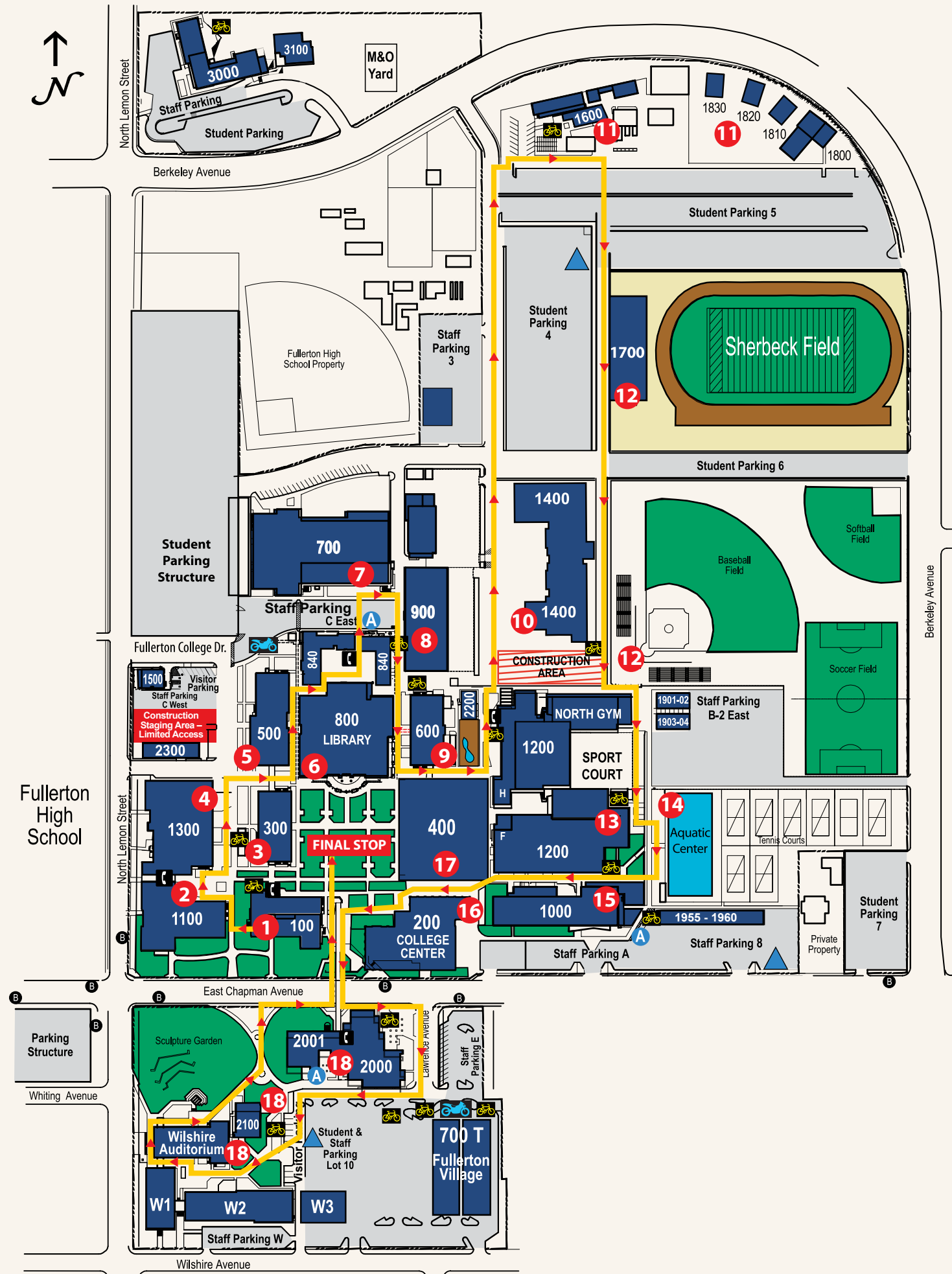

Dining Area on Campus



- 1 100 Building**
The 100 Building is the second oldest building on campus. It is home to administration, Financial Aid and classrooms.
- 2 1100 Building**
The 1100 Building is home to the Fine Arts Division and the music program. The building has practice rooms, recording studio, electronic music studio, iPod listening lab, choir classroom and band room.
- 3 300 Building**
The 300 Building was the first building constructed on campus. It now serves as home to the Business and Computer Information Systems Division and many classrooms.
- 4 1300 Building**
The 1300 Building houses the Campus Theatre and the Bronwyn Dodson Theatre. This building is also home to the Theatre Arts Division Office.
- 5 500 Building**
The 500 Building is where students will find the Humanities Division and the Assessment Center. Programs in this building include photography, foreign language, English, journalism and speech.
- 6 800 Building, Library-Learning Resource Center**
The majority of the 800 Building is made up of the William T. Boyce Library. Opened in 2005, this building offers students space to study, independently and as a group, research, make photo copies and print documents. To the side of the building, you will find the Academic Support Center. The ASC has a Writing Center, Tutoring Center, Reading lab, English as a Second Language lab, Disability Support Services Adaptive Computer Lab and the Math Lab.
- 7 700 Building**
The newly remodeled Technology and Engineering building is home to the Technology and Engineering Division and programs such as welding, construction technology, cosmetology, fashion, administration of justice, communications, industrial drafting, engineering and construction technology.
- 8 900 Building**
The newly constructed 900 Building is also part of the Technology and Engineering Division. It now houses the automotive technology, printing and machining programs.
- 9 600 Building**
This Building is the third oldest building on campus. Currently it is home to the Math Department and natural science classrooms.



- 10 1400 Building**
The 1400 Building joined the campus in 2008 and now serves as the home of the Social Sciences Division and programs. This building also has one of the largest classrooms on campus, with a maximum student capacity of 145.
- 11 1600 & 1800 Buildings**
The 1600 Building sits near the Berkeley Avenue entrance to the college and is home to the horticulture program. Also near the 1600 Building are the 1800 Buildings. The Child Development Lab School is housed in this area and is joined by other classrooms that host a variety of classes.
- 12 Athletic Facilities & 1700 Building**
Fullerton College has the following athletic facilities: baseball field, softball field, synthetic football/soccer field, track, grass soccer field, and tennis courts. The 1700 Building, also known as the Field House, sits on the edge of Sherbeck Field. It is home to PE offices and classrooms.
- 13 1200 Building**
This is the beginning of the college's athletic facilities. The Physical Education Division is housed in this building and offers students a variety of programs and sports. The building has locker rooms, two basketball gymnasiums, a dance studio, an athletic training/ sports therapist office and a weight training gym. The building also houses the Student Health Services office.
- 14 Aquatic Center**
The Aquatic Center was added to the campus in 2009. The 50-meter pool accommodates our water polo, swimming and diving programs. It also is home to many PE classes.
- 15 1000 Building**
The 1000 Building is home to the Art Department. The building houses the Fullerton College Art Gallery, which hosts a new exhibit every few months. Some of the Art programs in this building are drawing, ceramics, graphic design, 3D design, art computer graphics, painting, advertising design, jewelry making, stained glass, and life drawing.
- 16 200 Building**
The 200 Building is also known as the College Center. The College Center is comprised of the Dining Hall, Cadena Transfer Center, Student Center, Associated Students Office, Student Affairs Office, Office of Special Programs, International Student Center and meeting rooms.
- 17 400 Building**
The 400 Building is home to the Natural Sciences Division. Completed in 2011, the 400 building is the only 3-story building on campus. Besides regular classrooms, the building also has classrooms configured for chemistry, biology and physics.
